Stretching over 676,577 sq km, Myanmar is the second largest country in South-east Asia, behind Indonesia.

The country hosts more than 2000 occurrences of 72 different commodities, including lucrative deposits of tin, tungsten, copper, gold, silver, zinc, lead and precious stones.

There are 14 states in Myanmar, 13 of which can produce mining resources.

Myanmar is now the third-largest tin producer after China and Indonesia.

Extractive industries contribute 6% to GDP, 24% to government revenue, and 38% of exports.

Electricity demand is increasing 15% annually and is set to double by 2020

Following a policy shift, the government now encourages domestic and foreign investment in the energy sector, and private-sector actors now account for approximately 50% of all generated power.

The National Electrification Plan envisions goals of 50% electrification by 2020 and 100% by 2030.

Nearly 22 million people remain without access to electricity, which puts Myanmar behind only Indonesia for the number of people without access to electricity.

The World Bank has devised a plan to electrify the whole country by 2030- a target of 36GW-, which would require approximately \$3bn per year in investment, given current transmission, distribution and generation shortages.
